Spring Clean Up

The annual Spring Clean-up is scheduled June 6 -10. YOUR SPRING CLEAN UP DAY IS THE SAME DAY AS YOUR TRASH PICK UP. For example, if your trash is picked up on a Monday, your Spring Clean Up day will be Monday, June 6; if your trash is picked up on a Tuesday, your Spring Clean Up day will be Tuesday, June 7. To assure pickup, all items must be placed at the FRONT CURB by 8 a.m. on the scheduled day.

AFTER THE TRUCK HAS BEEN IN YOUR AREA, IT WILL NOT RETURN. If we fall behind schedule we will continue where we left off the following day.

Bulk Items that WILL be picked up include:

Furniture: dressers, tables, bookshelves, desks, headboards, etc, mattress sets, large carpets (cut into manageable bundles no longer than 4 ft), bulky items that don't fit in your garbage can (must be



contained), Appliances, glass portions of doors, windows, etc. NOTE: These must be broken and placed into small box marked "glass". Please also remove nails/staples or anything sharp that is exposed to prevent injury to you and the collector.

Bulk Items that WILL NOT be picked up include:

Construction debris: concrete, shingles, loose trash or trash in cardboard boxes, tires, lead/oil based paint, varnish, batteries, yard waste, fluorescent light bulbs, any other items not listed identified as hazardous waste, electronic waste: due to Illinois State Law, electronics cannot be disposed of in a landfill and therefore cannot be placed at the curb for pickup. This

includes televisions, computer monitors/accessories, DVD/VCR players, as well as several other items. For a complete list of banned items, and where to properly dispose of these items, contact Republic Services.

Consideration of bags/containers being less than 50 lbs. in weight is appreciated. If you have a question regarding a bulk item you want to dispose of, simply contact the Republic Services' Customer Resource Team at 656-6883 or republic-services.com and they will advise you on the best disposal method.

** SPECIAL PICKUPS **

Each Wednesday, Republic Services will pick up bulky items in front of your house for \$35 per pick-up truck load. You may make arrangements for this special pickup at your home by calling 656-6883.

Notes From The General Inspector

Twice a year, the City of Wood River offers its residents an opportunity to dispose of bulky items such as old furniture, carpet, and lumber at no charge. This is a service the City provides to its residents as a means of keeping Wood River clean and attractive. In order for this service to be a success, residents must participate by placing the items to be disposed at the front curb.

We strongly encourage people to participate in the program to help us in our efforts to keep Wood River a clean and attractive place to live. Please don't set your items out at the curb any sooner than one week prior to your scheduled pick up day.

Clean up Alleys - We receive many complaints about trash in alleys. City Code states that all trash must be placed in a watertight container of a solid and durable grade of metal or fire resistant plastic with a tightly fitted cover. So please help keep the alleys clean by placing your trash in tightly covered containers.

Trash Containers:

Garbage and rubbish shall be placed in watertight containers of solid and durable grade of metal or fire resistant plastic and shall be provided with a suitable handle or handles on the outside and with a tight fitted cover. PLEASE DO NOT PLACE YOUR GARBAGE OUT IN PLASTIC BAGS. Not only is this a violation of City Code subject to fines up to \$500/day, but allows animals to tear open scatter trash throughout the alleyway.

For information regarding trash and recycle pick-up, call the Public Services Department at 251-3122 or City Hall at 251-3100.

Parking in residential districts shall not be located in any required front yard, except in a driveway. Parking may be located in the side or rear yards as well.

Vehicles parked on public and/or private property MUST be licensed and

operable. If a vehicle does not comply, the City can have the vehicle towed at the owner's expense.

Recreational vehicles and utility trailers in Residential Districts shall comply with the following guidelines:

- Not more than one recreational vehicle or utility trailer on any lot.
- The parking of a recreational vehicle or utility trailer is allowed in the rear yard only.
- The parking of a recreational vehicle or utility trailer shall comply with the yard requirements for accessory buildings.
- The parking of a recreational vehicle or utility trailer shall not impede the light or air of a neighboring structure.

All of the above matters are Code violations and carry a fine of up to \$500/day.

Expired and Old Prescription Medicine Drop Off Location

The Wood River Police Department was awarded a grant from CVS Pharmacy to combat drug abuse by installing a drug collection unit. The new unit is located in the Police Department lobby, 111 N. Wood River Avenue, and will provide residents with a safe and environmentally responsible way to dispose of unwanted or expired medication, including controlled substances. Drop-offs can be made any-time, seven days a week. Drugs can be dropped off with no questions.

Animal Regulations

Two dogs per residence

Pets are an important part of our lives. Be sure to follow the rules for pet ownership for the health and welfare of the public as well as the pet. When you acquire a pet, it is important to make sure they receive the necessary inoculations and maintain good pet ethics.

Most importantly, for the safety of your pet, please do not allow your pet to run at large. This is a violation of the City's leash law. Cat owners must prevent their cats from becoming a public nuisance as defined by City Code. When walking your pet, please remember to pick up after them. Failure to comply with these codes could lead to a fine for the pet's owner.

The month of May is the time to renew your dog and cat tags. Dog tags are renewed on an annual basis and cat tags on a bi-annual basis. Contact the Finance Department at 251-3131 for further information.

City ordinance states that all persons shall be limited to ownership of TWO DOGS and three cats per residence.

If you are unsure of the City's regulations regarding pets, please contact the Police Department at 251-3131 or the City Clerk's Office at 251-3100.

YARD & GARAGE SALE NEWS

Along with warm weather comes yard/garage sales. Get your yard/garage sale permit FREE at the City Clerk's office Monday-Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Yard/garage sales are allowed two times a year with a duration not to exceed seventy-two (72) continuous hours. City code prohibits the placement of signs or advertising on utility poles, traffic control devices, or anywhere in the public right-of-way. We appreciate your cooperation and good luck with your sale.

Public Notices: *Good Things to Know*

Wood River Property Owners/Occupants

All City of Wood River property owners and occupants of real estate are hereby notified by this notice of the City's weed control ordinance and enforcement. It shall be unlawful for any owner or occupant of any lot of ground or premises to allow such lot or premises or any right-of-way or sidewalk adjoining such lot or premises, to be encumbered by any growth of grass or weeds over a height of eight inches.

Whenever any owner or occupant of real estate neglects to cut weeds or grass, as defined above, the weeds or grass may be cut by the City. The property owner will be billed for all expenses involved in having the weeds or grass cut. If the property owner fails to pay the billed expenses within 30 days, a lien may be filed pursuant to ILCS Ch. 65, Art. 5 § 11-20-7.

Please help by properly maintaining your property. Thank you.

Jim R. Burris, pictured center, was recognized as the 2015 Groundwater Water Operator of the Year at a state-wide event. The Mayor and City Council commended Jim for his commitment and dedication toward the City's goal of supplying the citizens of Wood River with clean, healthy, and safe drinking water.

Jim has served 19 years in the water industry, starting part-time at the age of 15 in the wastewater field. He holds a Class A Water Supply Operator Certification, and is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the water plant, 5 wells and 3 water towers. He has instituted large number of safety improvements within the plant, and has established many training opportunities for his 2 full-time and 3 floating personnel. His nomination stated that, "Jim's hard work and devotion has been proven in the many projects he has undertaken in order to make the treatment process better and improved the working environment."



Blake Marks for joining the 1,000 Point Club and ranking second as All-Time Lead Scorer. Blake scored a total of 1,463 points in his four years with the East Alton Wood River Oiler Basketball team and holds the All Time Single Game record with 51 points.

Zac Blasioli for his accomplishments of being a 3-time state qualifier becoming the first East Alton Wood River Community High School Oiler Wrestler to own multiple state medals finishing 2nd place in 2016 and



6th place in 2014, only the third Oiler in school history to wrestle for a state title and together with teammate, Drew Sobol, marked the first time in 63 years two Oiler wrestlers brought home state medals in the same season.

Drew Sobol for his accomplishments of being a 3-time state qualifier becoming East Alton Wood River Community High School Oiler Wrestler's 8th state medalist placing 4th in 2016. Drew received Co-Outstanding Wrestler honors at the Civic Memorial Tournament and was named Athlete of the Week twice in 2015.



Trace Gentry joined the 1,000-Point Club and ranked 4th as All Time Leading Scorer with his four years as a Roxana Senior High School Shell Basketball Team member. Trace scored 1,330 points and holds the most 3 pointers in one season (107); most 3 pointers in one game (9); and All Time Leader of Three Pointers (261). Trace was named to three All Tournament Teams in 2016.

Jarod Foiles brought home a 6th Place medal in the IHSA Individual State Wrestling Tournament, with All-State honors, becoming the 21st state medalist for the Roxana Senior High School Shell Wrestling Team. Jarod is a two-time state qualifier and was selected to compete in the Illinois vs. Indiana All Star Meet.



Lewis & Clark Jr. High School for being selected by their peers as the Division O Sportsmanship Award Winner for the second time. Good sportsmanship is one of the primary purposes of junior high school interscholastic activities program.
