## **Farewell Mayor Ufert**

It is with great sadness that we honor Fred E. Ufert, Mayor of Wood River, who passed away unexpectedly Wednesday, March 25, 2015. A lifelong resident of the area, Fred spent his entire life serving the public. From coaching the Legion Post Baseball Teams, serving on the Wood River Hartford School Board, East Alton Wood River Community High School Board, and City Council, to being elected Mayor the past ten years, Fred devoted his life to this community.

His dedication can be seen all around town – the Veterans Memorial located at the Roundhouse, the \$10 million sewer separation project which affects a 13 block area and over 100 homes, the flood control projects (Fox Acres Subdivision, East Alton Wood River High School, West side of Wood River Avenue), driving range at Belk Park Golf Course, Downtown Streetscape Program, purchase of Army Building for Public Service Department, renovation of City Hall, new playground equipment at West End Park, Governor Home Town Award, the

# Spring Clean Up



The annual Spring Clean-up is scheduled for June 1-5, 2015. YOUR SPRING CLEAN UP DAY IS THE **SAME DAY AS YOUR TRASH PICK UP**. For example, if your trash is picked up on a Monday, your Spring Clean Up day will be Monday, June 1; if your trash is picked up on a Tuesday, your Spring Clean Up day will be Tuesday, June 2. To assure pickup, all items must be placed at the FRONT CURB by 8 a.m. on the scheduled day.

AFTER THE TRUCK HAS BEEN IN YOUR AREA, IT WILL NOT RETURN. If we fall behind schedule we will continue where we left off the following day. The City will pick up large bulky items such as sofas, chairs, bedroom furniture, mattresses, tables, and carpet.

#### •• REGULATIONS ••

The State of Illinois has banned the following items from landfills. Therefore, we are sorry that WE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO PICK UP THE FOLLOWING ITEMS: stoves, furnaces, computers, computer monitors, refrigerators, hot water heaters, televisions, printers, washers, air conditioners, fax machines, electronic keyboards, dryers, humidifiers, VCRs, DVD players, freezers, de-humidifiers, electronic mice, scanners, dishwashers, trash compactors, cable receivers, satellite receivers, DVD recorders, small-scale servers, digital converter box, portable digital music player, videocassette recorders, video games consoles.

## OTHER ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP BE-CAUSE THEY ARE RESTRICTED IN THE LANDFILLS ARE:

- tires, automobile batteries, wheels, and large parts
- brush and landscape waste (leaves, grass, etc.)
- gasoline, motor oil, anti-freeze, etc.
- · liquid waste
- · hazardous waste
- unopened barrels
- · concrete blocks
- large amounts of building materials

Lumber will be accepted if it is cut into 4 foot lengths and tied in bundles weighing 75 pounds or less.

#### \*\*SPECIAL PICKUPS \*\*

Each Wednesday, Republic Services will pick up bulky items at the front curb for \$35 a truckload. You may make arrangements for this special pickup at your home by calling 656-6883.

## **Notes From The General Inspector**

Clean up Alleys-We receive many complaints about trash in alleys. City Code states that all trash must be placed in a watertight container of a solid and durable grade of metal or fire resistant plastic with a tightly fitted cover. So please help keep the alleys clean by placing your trash in tightly covered containers.

City ordinance states it shall be unlawful for any owner or occupant of any premises to allow such premises or any right-of-way or sidewalk adjoining such premises, to be encumbered by any growth of grass, weeds or bushes over a height of eight inches. Please remember to maintain your alley right-of-way, especially if you have a fence.

**Keep it Short**-Grass and weeds must be kept under 8" to comply with City ordinance. Let's help each other. If the City has to send you a letter and has to cut your grass, it ends up costing you a lot more than having it done yourself.

**Vehicles** parked on public and/or private property MUST be licensed and operable. If a vehicle does not comply, the City can have the vehicle towed at the owner's expense.

**Parking** in residential districts shall not be located in any required front yard, except in a driveway. Parking may be located in the side or rear yards as well.

**Recreational vehicles and utility trailers** in Residential Districts shall comply with the following guidelines:

- Not more than one recreational vehicle or utility trailer on any lot.
- The parking of a recreational vehicle or utility trailer is allowed in the rear yard only.
- The parking of a recreational vehicle or utility trailer shall comply with the yard requirements for accessory buildings.
- The parking of a recreational vehicle or utility trailer shall not impede the light or air of a neighboring structure.

All of the above matters are Code violations and carry a fine of up to \$500/day.

#### Trash, Recycle Pick Up, Appropriate Containers

Republic Services, the City's trash hauler, will pick up regular trash on your first collection day of the week and recyclable materials on the second collection day. If you have alley pick up, place your garbage in the alley, however, recycled materials must be placed on the front curb in the blue bin. Republic Services will not pick up regular trash on recycle day.

Garbage and rubbish shall be placed in watertight containers of solid and durable grade of metal or fire resistant plastic and shall be provided with a suitable handle or handles on the outside and with a tight fitted cover. PLEASE DO NOT PLACE YOUR GARBAGE OUT IN PLASTIC BAGS. Not only is this a violation of City Code subject to fines up to \$500/day, but allows animals to tear open scatter trash throughout the alleyway.

## Wood River Property Owners/Occupants

All City of Wood River property owners and occupants of real estate are hereby notified by this notice of the City's weed control ordinance and enforcement.

It shall be unlawful for any owner or occupant of any lot of ground or premises to allow such lot or premises or any right-of-way or sidewalk adjoining such lot or premises, to be encumbered by any growth of grass or weeds over a height of eight inches.

Any owner or occupant of real estate who neglects to cut weeds or grass, as defined above, the weeds or grass may be cut by the City. The property owner will be billed for all expenses involved in having the weeds or grass cut. If the property owner fails to pay billed expenses within 30 days, a lien may be filed pursuant to ILCS Ch. 65, Art. 5 § 11-20-7. Please help by properly maintaining your property. Thank you.

## **Storm Clean Up**

Following a storm, the Street Department will haul away branches that have fallen. Please place the branches at the front curb and contact the Public Services Office at 251-3122.

## **Appearance Awards**

The Appearance Board will be driving around town looking for residences and businesses that have made overall improvements. Appearance Awards will be given on a monthly basis at City Council meetings until September. ## New Trash and Recycling Company

The City has a new trash company for trash and recyclables, Republic Services. With the switch to this new company, the trash and recycle pick up times have changed. ## **Deposits on Streets** and Sidewalks

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to dump or deposit any grass, leaves, branches, gumballs, glass, nails or other similar articles, or any waste material on any public street, alley, or sidewalk in the City.

## **Brush Drop Off Policy**

Effective January 1, 2014, the City began issuing punch cards for brush drop off only. Residents are permitted to dump brush once a month. If additional brush drop off is requested, the City will need to verify that the brush is coming from that property. This does not affect grass and leaf drop off. Punch cards are issued at the dump facility on the first drop off. Future dumps for the resident will require the punch card to be presented. If you have questions, contact Public Services at 251-3122.

## **Solicitors**

City ordinance regulates peddlers and solicitors in residential neighborhoods. Individuals going door-to-door are required to have a City license. Before a license is issued, the Police Dept. runs a reference check on the individual for the safety and welfare of residents. Ask solicitors to see a city license. If there is no license or if the solicitor is acting in an undesirable manner, contact police at 251-3113. Remember a City license is not an endorsement of the firm or product. Established religious and charitable not-for-profit organizations are exempt,

## **Animal Regulations**

## Two dogs per residence

For the health and welfare of your pet as well as the community, it is important pets receive the necessary inoculations. Do not allow your pet to run at large. This is a violation of the City's leash law. Cat owners must prevent their cats from becoming a public nuisance as defined by City Code. When walking your pet, remember to pick up after them. Failure to comply could lead to fines for the pet owners.

May is the time to renew your dog and cat tags. Dog tags are renewed on an annual basis and cat tags on a bi-annual basis. Contact the Finance Department at 251-3131 for information.


