Public Services – Project Updates

Old Alton Edwardsville Road – This project will be a total reconstruction. Existing pavement will be removed and replaced. New storm sewers, sanitary sewers, and waterlines will be installed. The current cost estimate for the project is 1.6 million dollars. Preliminary engineering has begun. Construction could begin as soon as the Summer of 2024. It will take approximately 4 months to construct. Project is currently funded entirely with City funds.

Wood River Avenue Phase 1 and 2 – This is a rotomill and resurfacing project on Wood River Avenue from East Alton Village limits to Ferguson Avenue. All intersections will be upgraded to handicap accessibility and there will be new striping for this length of road. The current construction cost estimate is \$1,000,000. Project design has been completed and has a hopeful bid date sometime between July of 2023 and June of 2024. This timeline depends on the State Street Sewer Separation Project. It cannot be constructed until the Wood River Avenue part of that project is completed. Project construction costs are covered 75% by the State and 25% by the County. Project construction should begin within a month of bidding. Timing with the State Street Sewer Separation Project will affect when this project is to be constructed.

Edwardsville Road Waterline/State Street Waterline Phase 2 – This project will continue the new 12" water main on State Street and will run from Elble to Cotter then continue to Wood River Avenue on Edwardsville Road. Engineering has been completed. The project has been bid and the total cost is \$275,000. Construction will tentatively begin October 2023.

Manhole Lining Phase 3&4 – This project will line manholes and pipes that are in desperate need of rehabilitation. The lining will re-establish structural stability within the manholes and pipes and stop the manholes and pipes from leaking. Most of the manholes are brick and the old pipes are clay tile. All are well into 80 years of age. The City has been making inventory of remaining manholes to be done and will soon move to pipe lining. The current project cost estimate is approximately \$150,000. The next phase of linings will begin July 2024.

Public Services – Project Updates Continued

Edwardsville Road Phase 1 – This is a rotomill and resurfacing project on Edwardsville Road from East Alton Village limits to approximately 2nd Street in Wood River. Intersections will be upgraded to be handicap accessible. Project is a 2024/2025 project and could bid early as June 2024. Project construction costs are covered 75% by the State and 25% by the County. Project has begun preliminary engineering. The total construction cost is estimated to be \$630,000.

<u>Edwardsville Road Phase 2</u> – This is a rotomill and resurfacing project on Edwardsville Road from 2nd Street to 6th Street. Intersections will be upgraded to be handicap accessible. Project is a 2025/2026 project and could bid as early as June 2025. Project construction costs are covered 75% by the State and 25% by the County. Project has begun preliminary engineering. The total construction cost is estimated to be \$744,000.

1% Sales Tax – Project Updates

State Street Sewer Separation – This project consists of separating the combined sewers in the State Street Area. The area is bound by Wood River Avenue, Old St. Louis Road, Edwardsville Road, and State Route 143. The current construction cost estimate is 17 million dollars. Project construction costs are covered 75% by the Army Corp of Engineers and 25% by the City. The City received notice of a 3.5 million dollar grant from the Army Corp of Engineers to complete Phase 1, as well as notice of pending 3.5 million dollars for Phase 2. Project design is complete and is currently estimated for construction in January 2024 for Phase 1 and will last approximately 1 year. Phase 2 should begin shortly thereafter and will also last approximately 1 year.

<u>6th Street Detention Expansion</u> – Project will expand the capacity of the 6th Street Detention Pond and allow all the homes in that area to be removed from the flood zone. The current project cost estimate is 5 million dollars. Construction is currently estimated to begin Winter 2023/Spring 2024 and will last approximately 9 months.

<u>Sidewalk Project (Various)</u> – This project will replace sidewalks in various locations throughout the City. The total project construction cost is approximately \$250,000. Project is set to take place Summer 2024.

Recreation Center – It's hard to believe it's been over a year since ground was broken on the Recreation Center! We are nearing construction completion, and we anticipate the building being completed this December. The plan is for the building to be fully operational to the public in early January 2024. The major components that are still left on the building include: elevator install, gymnastics equipment install, fiber internet construction, glass window panels in the archway of the roof, gymnasium/track floor install, building signage, and recreation software implementation. We look forward to having an open house for the public to see the building in November. We will post that information to our Facebook page when the date is decided.


Deposits on Streets & Sidewalks

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to dump or deposit any grass, leaves, branches, gumballs, glass, nails or other similar articles or any waste materials on any public street, alley, or sidewalk in the City.



Leaf Burning Restrictions

Leaf burning is **ONLY ALLOWED** on Wednesdays & Saturdays from **October 1 through April 30** during daylight hours and a calm weather period with winds of less than ten miles per hour. The burning shall be supervised, and a water hose shall be available to extinguish the fire, if necessary. In addition, outdoor leaf burning must be done at a minimum of 15 feet from any structure and shall include only leaves falling from trees, plants, and shrubs. No leaf burning shall be allowed on any public street or alley and shall occur on private property only.

Holiday Trash Pick-Up Schedule 2023

Should a holiday occur on your regular pick-up day, service will be provided the following day for either trash or recyclables. Example: When a holiday falls on Monday, that route will be picked up on Tuesday, and the Tuesday route picked up on Wednesday. If there is a Thursday holiday that route will be picked up on Friday and Friday's route on Saturday. Remaining 2023 Holidays observed by the hauler are Thanksgiving Day & Christmas Day.

Snow Routes

Please remember during a snowstorm of two inches or more accumulation, it is unlawful to park on Snow Routes until the streets are cleared from curb to curb. If it is expected to snow overnight, please move your vehicles off the street before you go to bed for the night.

Fire News

October is fire prevention month and October 8th to October 14th is officially fire prevention week. This is an important time to educate our community about fire safety practices in your home.

Simple measures can mean so much:

- Smoke detectors should be installed in bedrooms, on each floor, mechanical/utility area, and as of January 2023 be working toward 10-year sealed battery units.
- Smoke and Carbon Monoxide detectors should be tested monthly, and replaced at expiration of detector or when they go bad.
- If you still have non-sealed smoke detectors, change detector batteries twice per year change your clock, change your batteries.
- Have a fire extinguisher in the house Recommended on each floor and in the garage.

Having and practicing a home fire escape plan is critical to ensure your family is best prepared in the event of a fire. This includes knowing two ways out, having an outside meeting place, and an understanding when you're out... you stay out (never go back in)! If there is smoke, make sure to stay low to the floor.

Teach young ones to know when to call 9-1-1 and have a plan for multiple floor and basement emergencies.

Remember: The Fire Department provides free home fire safety inspections and has a smoke detector installation program, just contact the Fire Station at 618-259-0984, Option 1.

Hydrant Flushing

The City will be flushing and testing Fire Hydrants from October 16th through the 20th. Residents may experience some discoloration of their water. However, the water will continue to be safe to drink. Residents may want to avoid doing laundry during this time to avoid discoloration of clothing. If you must do laundry, check the water before you put in the clothes. Despite the inconvenience of the discolored water, it is necessary to flush fire hydrants to remove any sediment that may have settled in the water mains and to ensure the hydrants remain in good working order. If you have questions, call the Water Division at 618-251-3133.

Ever wonder what the grey cap is on the big discharge of a fire hydrant? The Fire Department in cooperation with the Water Department have been replacing 4" steamer discharge caps with Storz adapters. This allows the Fire Department to secure our water supply hose directly to the largest discharge of a fire hydrant. It helps to maximize the available water in that area. This project is nearing completion. If you don't see this grey capped appliance, either we haven't got to it yet or the hydrant doesn't allow for that option.

- Unattached trailers/R.V.'s cannot be parked on the streets at any time.
- Any vehicle parked on your property must have a valid registration and not be considered a derelict vehicle.
