The City of Wood River proudly celebrated the grand opening of its brand-new Downtown Dog Park in September 2025. The ribbon cutting ceremony brought together community members, City staff, and their furry friends to mark this exciting addition to the City of Wood River.

Public Services – Project Updates

Wood River Avenue Phase 1 & 2 – This is a rotomill and resurfacing project on Wood River Avenue from East Alton Village limits to Ferguson Avenue. All intersections will be upgraded to handicap accessible. There will be new striping for this length of road. The current construction cost estimate is \$1,500,000. Project design has been completed and has a hopeful bid date of January 2026. This timeline depends on the State Street Sewer Separation Project. It cannot be constructed until the Wood River Avenue part of that project is completed. Project construction costs are covered 75% by the State and 25% by the County. Project construction will hopefully begin within a month of bidding.

Edwardsville Road Phase 1 & 2 – This is a rotomill and resurfacing project on Edwardsville Road from East Alton Village limits to approximately 6th Street in Wood River. Intersections will be upgraded to be handicap accessible. Project is a 2025-26 project and is anticipated to bid as early as Spring 2026. Project construction costs are covered 75% by the State and 25% by the County. Project has begun engineering. The total construction cost is estimated to be \$1,600,000.

Edwardsville Road Phase 3 — This is a rotomill and resurfacing project on Edwardsville Road from approximately 6th Street to East Acton Avenue. Intersections will be upgraded to be handicap accessible. The project has been submitted for funding through the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program which construction costs are covered 75% by the State and 25% by the County.

1% Public Services Project List

State Street Sewer Separation – This project consists of separating the combined sewers in the State Street Area. The area is bound by Wood River Avenue, Old St. Louis Road, Edwardsville Road, and State Route 143. The current construction cost estimate is \$20,825,000. Project construction costs are covered 75% by the Corp of Engineers and 25% by the City. The City received notice of a 3.5 million dollar grant from the Corp of Engineers to complete Phase 1, as well as notice of a pending 3.5 million grant for Phase 2. Construction started in May 2024 for Phase 1 and will last approximately a year and a half. Due to field issues, construction progress has been slower and the project scope for Phase 1 has changed. Construction costs are anticipated to increase to \$9.2 Million for Phase 1. The current anticipated completion date for Phase 1 is December 2025.

<u>9th Street Detention Expansion</u> – Project will expand the capacity of the 6th Street retention pond and create a new detention pond located on City owned property just east of 9th Street and will allow homes in that area to be removed from the flood zone. The current project estimate is 8 million dollars with \$850,000 recently allocated from the Federal Government in March 2024. Project requires environmental clearances before the City can complete engineering design and begin construction. Construction is currently estimated to begin in late Fall 2025/Spring 2026 and will last approximately 18 months.

<u>Sidewalk Project (Various)</u> – This project will replace sidewalks in various locations in conjunction with the City's overlay projects. The total project construction cost is approximately \$500,000. Progress is ongoing, and the City continues making sidewalk improvements as funding allows.

<u>Jackson Ln. & Vaughn Dr. Water Main Improvements</u> – This project will replace an aging 4-inch water main with a new 8-inch main along Jackson Lane and new 6-inch main along Vaughn Drive. The project construction cost is approximately \$260,000. Construction is anticipated to begin Spring 2026. <u>Ferguson – 4th Street to 6th Street CIPP (Cured-in-Place-Pipe) Lining</u> – The project consists of lining the existing 18-inch sewer main between 4th Street and 6th Street on Ferguson Avenue. The project construction cost is \$250,000. The project is anticipated to start and be completed in Fall 2025.


Leaf Burning Restrictions

Leaf burning is **ONLY ALLOWED** on **Wednesdays & Saturdays** from **October 1 through April 30** during daylight hours and a calm weather period with winds of less than ten miles per hour. The burning shall be supervised, and a water hose shall be available to extinguish the fire, if necessary. In addition, outdoor leaf burning must be done at a minimum of 15 feet from any structure and shall include only leaves falling from trees, plants, and shrubs. No leaf burning shall be allowed on any public street or alley and shall occur on private property only.

Deposits on Streets & Sidewalks

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to dump or deposit any grass, leaves, branches, gumballs, glass, nails or other similar articles or any waste materials on any public street, alley, or sidewalk in the City.

The City flushes and tests fire hydrants twice a year. These times include the beginning of May and the beginning of October. Residents may experience discoloration of their water. However, the water will continue to be safe to drink. Residents may want to avoid doing laundry during this time to avoid discoloration of clothing. Despite the inconvenience of the discolored water, it is necessary to flush fire hydrants to remove any sediment that may have settled in the water mains and to ensure the hydrants remain in good working order.

Fire Department News

October is fire prevention month and is an important time to educate our community about fire safety practices in your home. Having and practicing a home fire escape plan is critical to ensure your family is best prepared in the event of a fire. This includes knowing two ways out, having an outside meeting place, and an understanding when you're out... you stay out (never go back in)! If there is smoke, make sure to stay low to the floor. Teach young ones to know when to call 9-1-1 and have a plan for multiple floor and basement emergencies.

Fire Chief Recommendations:

- Install 10-year lithium-ion sealed smoke detectors.
- Smoke detectors within 15 feet of sleeping areas.
- Smoke detectors in each sleeping area and each floor of occupancy and/or stairwells.
- Replace batteries every 6 months.
- Replace smoke detectors every 8-10 years.
- Carbon Monoxide detector in each occupancy.
- Have and practice a home fire escape plan.

The Fire Department provides Life Safety inspections for all residents and occupancies in the City. Partnered with the OSFM and Red Cross, smoke detectors are available for property owners in need or otherwise determined appropriate. The Wood River Fire Department is near completion of the much-needed facelift to the 1986 'Central' Fire Station, as well as the completion of the storage area on the back of the Fire Station. This will allow the Fire Department to house and immediately respond with critical resources from the Fire Station, as these are currently housed in different areas of the City. The department has also accepted delivery of two new pumpers, one ordered in November 2022, and the other demo pumper that replaced the 2000 American LaFrance. Now that the ordered pumper has arrived, the demo pumper will be getting some additional work completed to bring it up to Wood River Fire Department Specifications. More to come in the Spring as both pumpers and the Fire Station will be highlighted in the Spring 2026 Pipeline as well as an Open House Event!

Congratulations to *Engineer/EMT Jarrod Horyn* for successfully completing the Christian Hospital Paramedic Academy. Engineer/EMT Horyn is now completing his paramedic team lead field internship and will challenge the National Registry Paramedic written exam by the end of October 2025.


